





## Word Cards

<p><b>7</b>  <b>separation of powers</b></p>  <p>power is separated, or divided, among three branches of government</p> <p><i>Example:</i> Separation of power helps to prevent any one branch from becoming too powerful.</p> <p>(SS050102)</p>	<p><b>8</b>  <b>branches of government</b></p> <p>three parts of government, each with separate powers</p> <p><i>Example:</i> The United States Constitution separates power among the three branches of government. One branch of government makes laws, another branch enforces the laws, and the third branch interprets what the laws mean.</p> <p>(SS050102)</p>
<p><b>9</b>  <b>legislative branch</b></p>  <p>the branch of government that makes laws</p> <p><i>Example:</i> The legislative branch made several laws relating to water pollution.</p> <p>(SS050102)</p>	<p><b>10</b>  <b>executive branch</b></p>  <p>the branch of government that enforces laws</p> <p><i>Example:</i> It is up to the executive branch to enforce new laws.</p> <p>(SS050102)</p>
<p><b>11</b>  <b>judicial branch</b></p>  <p>the branch of government that decides what laws mean</p> <p><i>Example:</i> The judicial branch is made up of the Supreme Court and other courts as created by Congress.</p> <p>(SS050102)</p>	<p><b>12</b>  <b>articles</b></p> <p>parts of the Constitution</p> <p><i>Example:</i> The first three articles of the Constitution establish the three branches of government</p> <p>(SS050102)</p>
